

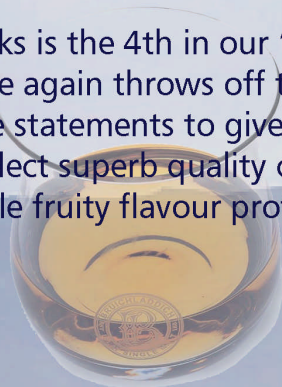

## TASTING NOTE Bruichladdich Rocks

Bruichladdich Rocks is the 4th in our 'Designer Collection' where Bruichladdich once again throws off the shackles of the traditional Scotch whisky age statements to give Master Distiller, Jim McEwan, the freedom to select superb quality casks from a variety of ages to create an incredible fruity flavour profile, at a ground-breaking price for Bruichladdich.



**Colour** Tea Rose/ Wild Raspberry.

**Body** Light, bright and full of the joys! A vibrant spirit brimming with the unique flavours of the Hebrides.

**Nose** It has an exhilarating bouquet, opening with soft red grapes, red currant jelly, pomegranate and red apple all encased in an envelope of syrup, sweet malted barley and brown sugar vanilla. It's snappy and sweet, zipping along on the crest of a wave migrating from Islay to France but always returning to the homeland.

**Palate** It jumps right out of the glass anxious to please. Lots of Celtic fire and spirit. The wine flavours wait patiently while the malt and oak display their charms - then given time they emerge bringing red cherry, strawberry and spiciness. It has a yogurt like texture, really creamy yet still retains a snappy coastal crispness.

For such a virile malt it's outrageously drinkable.

**Finish** It's a malt on a mission. Does not hang around, quick as a flash it's gone leaving you wondering, should I have bought an extra bottle?  
Yes!!
